Dear Parents and Community Members,

This is the third year that 7 and 8 grade students participated in the Smarter Balanced Assessment. We have limited longitudinal data to determine trends. However, our scores indicate we have a lot of room for improvement and are will be researching and implementing interventions to better serve our students. The report card also indicates that less than 95% of our students participated in the assessment which creates potential volatility in the data to a reduced sample size. This is due to parents opting out of participating in the assessment or were not able to test due to other factors.

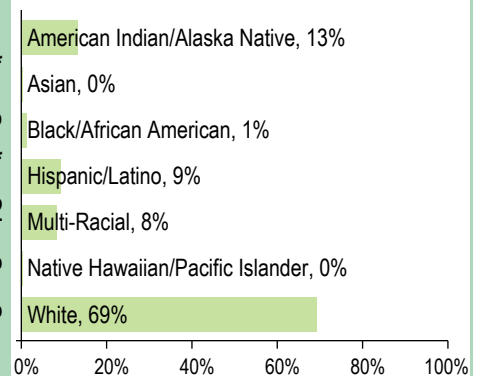
