Crestview Heights Families,

Recently our school has experienced two separate incidents involving students bringing potentially dangerous items to school and then sharing the item(s) with a peer. In both cases, the incident was promptly investigated in accordance with our school district policies and safety procedures, and no students or staff were harmed.

Our School Resource Officer, Deputy Bruster, has assisted me with the investigation and follow-up of each of these incidents. He also recently visited each of the classrooms in our school to introduce himself to students and encourage all of them to help keep our school safe by reminding them, "If you hear/see something unsafe, say something to an adult right away."

Children learn valuable lessons from adults, particularly their parents, when we discuss the proper use of potentially dangerous items, including the time and place that they are allowed to be used, if at all. Please help our school family by taking time to discuss with your child the following:

- What are your own family's rules and expectations regarding items such as guns (both real and toy), knives, fireworks, bows/arrows, etc.?
- To keep Crestview safe for everyone, the rule is: no unsafe items at school. Ask your child to commit to this school expectation.
- Remind your child: If you see or hear about an unsafe item at school, it is your job to help keep it safe by telling an adult right away.
